

# Recycling Instructions for Residents

This property provides single stream recycling to all residents – all recyclables can be placed in the same bin. Clean and dry all recyclable materials and place in the building's designated recycling receptacles.

## Recyclable Items



### METAL

aluminum and steel cans

### PLASTIC

numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7

### GLASS

bottles, jugs, and jars



### PAPER

newspapers, junk mail, magazines, paperboard

### CARDBOARD

please flatten



### CARDBOARD CARTONS

beverage and soup cartons

**what to do with the rest...** Pennsylvania Resources Council (PRC) collects items that don't belong in the trash or recycling bins at collection events throughout the year. Bring cleaners, pesticides, paints, automotive fluids, and other products containing hazardous components to a **Household Chemical Collection Event**. Bring ewaste, compact fluorescent bulbs, alkaline batteries, and more to one of PRC's **Hard to Recycle Collection Events**.
