## **Household Hazardous Waste**

Best practices for selecting, storage, and disposal

#### **Choosing products**



Avoid surplus HHW by only purchasing as much as you need for the task. Recycling is great, but not as impactful as reducing waste in the first place!

# **WARNING**

How do I know if a product is hazardous?

Look for warning labels that include words and phrases like

poison toxic warning danger corrosive flammable

Keep out of reach of children

#### **Store safely**

Follow safe storage instructions on the product label and keep these best practices in mind.

Keep products in their original containers and do not remove safety labels. Do not combine HHW products or reuse empty containers.

Seal tightly and store in a cool, dry place away from children, pets, and food products.

Separate flammables, corrosives, and poisons from other materials and place on separate shelves.

#### **Dispose responsibly**

HHW is not safe to be burned, buried, thrown in the trash or backyard, or poured in the drain or storm sewer.

If products are still usable, consider donating.

### What to do if my container is leaking?

Place the entire container in a plastic bucket with a tightfitting lid and surround it with a non-flammable absorbent, such as kitty litter. PA DEP Recycling Hotline: 800-346-4242
